Clive Grant began learning the organ at Canterbury Cathedral, with Dr Alan Wicks, and as an undergraduate in Cambridge was Organ Scholar at the University Church of Great St Mary, continuing his studies with Gerald Gifford and Peter Hurford. After graduating he remained in Cambridge to continue his studies in organ, harpsichord, piano accompaniment and voice. During that time he attended master classes in London and Paris. He is currently Head of Music and the Expressive Arts Faculty at St Bartholomew's School, Newbury; an organist, choral trainer and until recently tutor in theory and musicianship for Berkshire Maestros. He is a Music Consultant with West Berkshire LEA, an examiner for Edexcel A-level Music Technology a mentor for PGCE music students at Reading University, and a Quality Consultant with West Berkshire Training Partnership. He regularly runs CPD workshops for teachers nationwide, focusing on the effective use of ICT in the music curriculum. He is also Chairman of the Neil Webster Music Trust, a local organisation that provides funding for the development of young singers and choral conductors. In 2006 he was elected a Fellow of the Royal Society of Arts.

Steve Bowey studied organ and piano from an early age, regularly playing at St Francis' and St Andrew's Churches in Coulsdon. After studying Engineering at Salford University he moved to Newbury to work for Vodafone. In 1991 he was appointed accompanist of the Cromwell Singers and became their musical director in 1993. From 1992, he was Director of Music at St Mary's Church, Shaw-cum-Donnington, and regularly accompanies for local choirs, including the Douai Choral Society, the Downland Chorale, the RSCM Southern Cathedral Singers, Berkshire Maestros youth choirs, Worcester College Oxford and Newbury Choral Society. He is a regular performer in the Newbury and District Organists' Association lunchtime recital series and has also given recitals in Thaxted, Caterham, Manchester and Farnham. In 2001 he was appointed Musical Director of the Sandham Singers. In 2006 Steve joined the Royal College of Organists, becoming ARCO in July 2007 with the Limpus prize for performance, as well as the Sowerbutts and Samuel Baker prizes. After further study, he was awarded the Fellowship diploma (FRCO) in January 2011.

Cantemus was founded in 1999 with the aim of performing a wide variety of sacred and secular music, both accompanied and unaccompanied, ranging from the Renaissance to the present day. The Choir undertakes four performances a year primarily in the West Berkshire area. All our concerts seek to raise money for good causes.
